PUBLIC FIRE PROTECTION

Available: To the Town of Machias for municipal fire protection.

Rates: For the existing hydrants as installed December 1, 2020:

Rate for hydrants installed after December 1, 2020 shall be determined in accordance with the Public Utilities Commission Rules and Regulations Chapter 69.

All public fire hydrants now existing or to be installed will be cared for and maintained in good working order (unavoidable accidents excepted) by the Company. Once any fire hydrant is actually installed and in operation, the total annual fire protection service charge then in effect will not be reduced should the municipality served order one or more hydrants discontinued.

Should the municipality served order any hydrant or hydrants moved to a different location, the municipality served shall pay to the Company all costs of moving said hydrant or hydrants.
